We'll critically examine the data within the sociohistorical contexts of class, gender, and racial politics of Atlanta, the South, and the broader US.

She wrote the Widow Spy which includes details from the first seven years of her career.

Bio: I taught journalism for 19 years as a professor at Washington & Lee University. This academic stretch came after 26 years of reporting, writing and editing for metro papers (including the AJC in the 90s) and magazines.
